Eligible Applicants

Any entity that **currently** provides middle-mile, last-mile, or Anchor Institution broadband services, including:

- Cooperative
- Corporation
- LLC
- Partnership
- Non-profit
- Private business entity
- Units of Government

Eligible Areas

- Areas lacking middle-mile broadband infrastructure to anchor institution facilities
- Areas with an identified need for service and facilitate the deployment of last-mile broadband in unserved areas of the state

Eligible Projects

Project must be designed to provide:

- Anchor Institution broadband services that meets or exceeds 1/1 Gbps
- Middle-mile broadband services that can support last-mile broadband service that meets or exceeds 100/100 Mbps
- Discounts under the Affordable Connectivity Program or the provision of a broad-based affordability program

Eligible Costs

Funds are generally limited to construction and construction-related costs of broadband infrastructure, including:

- Repair, rehabilitation, construction, improvement, and acquisition of broadband infrastructure for the project
- Long-term leases (greater than one year) of facilities required to provide broadband service for the project (including indefeasible right-of-use agreements and capital leases)
- Project-deployment personnel-related costs

Note: Operating costs, indirect costs, and any costs incurred before or after the term of the AIMM subaward agreement are not eligible for reimbursement

Selection Criteria

Scoring (maximum of 175 points):

- Anchor Institution connectivity up to 45 points
- Facilitation of Last-Mile connectivity up to 25 points
- Percentage of service area unserved up to 30 points
- Applicants Managerial capabilities up to 35 points
- Cost Effectiveness up to 25 points
- Private investment, efficiency and MBE/WBE utilization up to 15 points
