Eligible Projects

 Qualifying last-mile broadband projects ounserved (25/3 Mbps or less) and underserved (between 25/3 and 100/20 Mbps) locations

Eligible Applicants

- Cooperatives
- Nonprofit Organizations
- Public-Private Partnerships
- Private Companies
- Public or Private Utilities
- Public Utility Districts
- Local Governments

Eligible Areas

 Project areas will be discrete "Project Area Footprints" (PAF's) consisting of groups of Census Block Groups (CBS's).

Eligible Costs

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and MDUs
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible multi-family residential building
- Network software upgrades
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, and community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations

Selection Criteria

Determination of Priority Broadband Project vs Non-Priority Broadband Project

- **Primary Scoring**: Applications within the same project area, the application with the lowest grant request will be selected
- **Secondary Scoring**: Applicants within 15% of the lowest grant request for the same application area, the following selection criteria will be applied
 - **Preliminary subgrantee** If selected as a preliminary grantee in a previous round, that applicant will be selected
 - Speed of Network and Other Technical Capabilities If applicant not awarded using previous criteria, the applicant with the highest technical capabilities will be selected
 - Speed of Deployment If applicant not selected using previous criteria, the applicant with the fastest speed to deployment will be selected
