Eligible Applicants

- Capital Projects Fund eligible subrecipients
 - Units of government (e.g., municipalities or counties)
 - Non-profits or private entities
 - Cooperatives, electric utilities
 - Other entities that build or operate broadband networks

Eligible Areas

- Unserved Area no access to wireline or fixed wireless broadband internet service with speeds of at least 25/3 Mbps
- Underserved Area no access to wireline or fixed wireless broadband internet service with speeds of at least 100/20 Mbps

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Eligible Projects

- Goal: Bring high-speed internet access to all Coloradans
- Focus: Areas that currently have no access or poor access Middle-mile infrastructure
- Ideal proposals will:
 - Build or improve Colorado's middle-mile broadband infrastructure
 - Address unserved under 25/3 Mbps or underserved between 25/3 Mbps and 100/20 Mbps areas
 - Involve community-driven partnerships between municipalities, providers and other stakeholders
 - Community-driven projects refer to municipalities working with internet service providers (ISPs), nonprofits, schools, hospitals, multi-use facilities, etc., to develop plans that address their community's broadband needs
- 25% match required
 - Waivers can be granted if an applicant can demonstrate economic hardship
- LOI is not required, nor is it a guarantee of funding
