

BEAD Map Challenge Process

Key Dates

June 17, 2024: Publication of Eligible Locations July 8 – August 6, 2024: Challenge Submission Window (30 days)

August 7– August 20, 2024: Evidenciary Review of Challenges (14 days)

August 21 – September 19, 2024: Rebuttal Submission Window (30 days)
 September 20 – October 19, 2024: Final Determination (30 days)
 November 4, 2024: Submit results to NTIA to approve or reverse determinations

Eligible Challengers

- Non-Profits
- Tribal Governments
- Local Governments
- Broadband Service Providers

Allowable Challenges

- BEAD eligibility. These include challenges to:
 - Availability
 - o Speed
 - o Data Cap
 - Latency
 - Technology
 - Business service only
- Enforceable Commitments
- Planned or Existing Service (deployed by June 30, 2024)
- Identification of eligible Community Anchor Institutions
- Community Anchor Institution BEAD eligibility determination

*Speed tests will be collected from individuals to be submitted by an eligible challenger in order to determine eligibility.

Submission Process

- Request a free CostQuest License
- The two license tiers available for the BEAD Challenge Process are:
 - Tier D: For entities that participate in any federal broadband programs. Licensees will be similar to those with an FCC Fabric Tier 2 license. Please follow the guide for requesting a TIER D License
 - Tier E: For entities that will challenge "Pass Through Entity" coverage maps (i.e. the CBO). Licensees will be similar to those with an FCC Fabric Tier 4 license.
 Please follow the guide for requesting a TIER E License
- Register at California's <u>BEAD Challenge Portal</u>
- Selection of type and location of challenge
 - Submission of evidence
 - \circ File uploads
 - Narrative support
- Notification to challenged entities
- Rebuttal submission (if necessary)
