Eligible Applicants

- For-profit Entities
- Nonprofit Telephone Cooperatives
- Nonprofit Rural Electric Associations that existed on May 10, 2014
- Applicants and appellants are required to submit granular mapping data to the CBO

Eligible Areas

Unserved Locations

- Outside municipal boundaries or within a city with a population of fewer than 7,500 inhabitants
- Consists of households that lack access to at least one provider of a broadband network that uses satellite technology and at least one provider of a broadband network that uses non-satellite technology
- Any portion of a state or interstate highway corridor that lacks access to a provider of a broadband network

Eligible Projects

Acquisition, installation, and construction of Middle Mile and Last Mile infrastructure that supports broadband service in unserved areas

Eligible Costs

- Construction
- Permitting
- Network Planning and Design
- Network Infrastructure Deployment
- Network Facilities
- Capitalized Equipment
- Real property when purchased for project

Selection Criteria

Funding prioritized based on award criteria:

- Reginal Planning Project is consistent with regional broadband plan.
- Purpose Project will enhance economic development, telehealth, education, public safety
- Speed Downstream and Upstream service meets minimum speeds
- Matching Funds Amount of matching funds relative to the award
- Geographic Distribution Areas that have not already received funding
- Licensing Whether project provides licensed or unlicensed means of transmission
- Redundancy sufficient network redundancy, physical diversity, and latency to reliably serve the Area
- Costs Cost-effectiveness of the project
- Low-income Support Plan to serve low-income households
- Critically Unserved provide service in Area determined to be "Critically Unserved"
