Funding Amount

Up to \$400 million from Florida (FL) General Revenue Funds

- Maximum grant amount of \$5 Million for a single project
- Grant awards may not fund more than 50% of total project cost

Eligible Areas

Areas that lack at least 25/3 Mbps broadband service per FL Statutes

Eligible Projects

Installation or deployment of infrastructure that supports the provision of reliable, affordable high-speed broadband internet service

Mapping Issues

- Applications must include a service map of the proposed funding service area (PFSA) in both PDF version and a spatial version (.shp, .kml, or .kmz format)
 - Last-Mile Project: Includes service area boundaries and place names, boundaries, buildings, road/street names or other features that clearly identify the PFSA
 - Middle-Mile Project: Indicate the location of the middle mile facilities that will be placed
 - Label the map as "Attachment 3-B"
- Applications must include a network map of the PFSA in both PDF version and a spatial version (.shp, .kml, .kmz format)
 - Label the map as "Attachment 3-C"

Application Contents

- Applicant must be registered in SAM.gov, and provide Unique Entity ID generated by SAM.gov
- An application must include:
 - Application Overview
 - Executive Summary
 - Project Location Data and Maps
 - Project Impact
 - Project Budget
 - Funding Sources
 - Economic and Community Impact
 - Economic Distress
 - Community Support
 - Alignment with State Strategic Plan
 - Project Readiness
 - Network Scalability
 - Project Viability and Sustainability
 - Affordability and Adoption Assistance
 - Service Packaging and Customer Acquisitions
 - Appendix for Key Attachments



Evaluation Criteria

- Eligible Applicants must obtain a minimum evaluation score of 130 points to be considered for funding; however, this does not guarantee an award
- Points will be awarded to applications that leverage additional funds totaling 50% or more of total eligible project costs
 - 50% non-state match is not required for an application to be competitive
- Evaluation Criteria
 - Broadband Impact (50 points)
 - Network Scalability (35 points)
 - Project Viability & Sustainability (35 points)
 - Economic Distress (40 points)
 - Funding Sources and Community Support (40 points)
 - Alignment with Florida Strategic Plan (40 points)
 - Project Readiness (40 points)
 - Affordability & Adoption Assistance (20 points)

Buildout Requirements

- Recipients required to expend funds by December 31, 2026
- Applicants must offer one low-cost option without data usage caps, at speeds sufficient for a multiple user household to simultaneously engage in telework and remote learning
- Infrastructure must deliver service that reliably meets or exceeds 100 Mbps symmetrical

Eligible Costs

Per Mile Deployed Costs (Last or Middle Mile)

- Planning and Construction Costs
 - Engineering Design
 - Permitting
 - Pre-Construction Costs (Make-Ready)
 - Outside Plant Materials (fiber, poles, hardware, conduit, splitters, etc.)
 - Labor
 - Construction Management

Fixed Wireless Project Costs

- Per Premise Covered Costs
 - Engineering Design
 - Permitting
 - Pre-Construction Cost
 - Spectrum
 - Tower Site Acquisition and Construction
 - Fiber Backhaul Construction
 - Labor
 - Construction Management
 - Base Station Equipment
