Eligible Projects

- Unserved locations: Locations without wired infrastructure to access the Internet
- **Underserved locations:** Locations with wired Internet infrastructure that do not support the minimum speeds (100/ 20Mbps)
- **CAIs:** Existing community organizations or public spaces that provide access and support services to the public with less than 1Gbps/1Gbps

Eligible Areas

Elible areas will be determined by the broadband office challenge process

Eligible Costs

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, including infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and multi tenant buildings
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible multi-family residential building
- Network software upgrades
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, and community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations

Selection Criteria

Scoring (maximum of 365 points): Primary criteria

- **Minimal BEAD Outlay (up to 150 points):** scored intwo parts, the amount of BEAD funding requested and the the match amount.
 - Part 1: Requested BEAD funding amount: (up to 100 points): The applicant requesting the LOWEST amountwill receive maximum score
 - Part 2: Proposed Match amount: (up to 50 points): The applicant offering the HIGHEST match will receive the maximum score
 - o Points from Part 1 and Part 2 equal total points for Minimal BEAD Program Outlay
- **Affordability (up to 100 points**): The applicant proposing the least expensive 1 Gbps symmetrical, FTTP service will receive full points.
- Fair & Safe Labor Practices (up to 75 points):
 - 75 points for a record of and plans to be in compliance with all of the minimum and highly desired requirements
 - 65 points for proposals that fully demonstrate a record of and plans to be in compliance with all of the minimum requirements only

Minimum requirements:

- Paying prevailing wages and benefits, including compliance with the Federal Davis-Bacon, the State's Wages and Hours of Employees on Public Works, and Service Contract Act requirements, where applicable, and certified payrolls
- Use of an appropriately skilled workforce
- Use of an appropriately credentialed workforce
- Taking steps to prevent the misclassification of workers

Highly desired requirements:

- Using project labor agreements
- Use of local hire provisions
- Commitments to union neutrality
- Use of labor peace agreements



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Selection Criteria (cont'd)

Secondary criteria

- **Speed Deployment (up to 30 points):** Points awarded based on the proposed months to complete the project using thisformula: 48 minus the proposed number of months, divided by 48, multiplied by the maximum number of points

 For example:
 - o **15 points** for completing the build within 24 months
 - 11.25 points for completing the build within 30 months
 - 7.5 points for completing the build within 36 months

Secondary criteria

- **Speed Deployment (up to 30 points):** Points awarded based on the proposed months to complete the project using this formula: 48 minus the proposed number of months, divided by 48, multiplied by the maximum number of points For example:
 - o **15 points** for completing the build within 24 months
 - o **11.25 points** for completing the build within 30 months
 - 7.5 points for completing the build within 36 months
- Speed of Network (up to 20 points):
 - 10 points for 1000/35 & less than 100ms
 - 8 points for 300/35 & less than 100ms
 - 6 points for 250/35 & less than 100ms
- **Longevity (up to 5 points):** Life spans of 15 years or greater receive the maximum number of points, Ispans shorter than 15 years receive a prorated amount
- Cost-effectiveness of Future Scalability (up to 5 points): Describe the scalability of
 the installed assets and the cost-effectiveness of future upgrades (such as maximum speed
 increases)
- Open Access (up to 10 points): Open access offerings shall be evaluated on cost, accessibility, interoperability as well as factors that would negatively impact the use of open access offerings.
