Eligible Projects

• Projects deploying qualifying last-mile broadband infrastructure to unserved (25/3 Mbps or less) and underserved (between 25/3 and 100/20 Mbps) locations

Eligible Areas

• Project area units are determined by the applicant during Round 1. If additional rounds are necessary, DOM will designate project areas

Eligible Costs

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, including infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and multi tenant buildings
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible multi-family residential building
- Network software upgrades
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, and community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations

Selection Criteria

Determination of Priority Broadband Broadband Project vs Non-Priority Broadband Project

Primary Criteria

• **Minimal BEAD Program Outlay** calculated using project cost minus funding requested divided by number of eligible service locations

Secondary Criteria

- Only applicable to proposals with one or more overlapping location, an dcost within 15% of lowest-cost proposal received
 - 20 points Speed to Deployment
 - **60 points** Speed of Netowrk (Relative Speed)
 - **20 points** Speed of Network (Latency)
