Eligible Projects

 Priority Broadband Projects, defined as project that provides internet services via end-toend fiber-optic facilities to reach users. MIHI has a strong preference for Priority Broadband Projects, and anticipates that all Round 1 projects will be deploying end-to-end fiber.

Eligible Areas

Available based on results of the BEAD State Challenge Process.

Selection Criteria

Primary Criteria

- **Grant to Project Cost (14 points):** Ratio of requested grant fund compared to the total project cost. Greater matching funds will score more points.
- **Total Project Cost (14 points):** Total projected cost required to complete the project, awarding more points to proposed projects that have lower overall BEAD outlay.
- Scalability and Resiliency (7 points): This category scores whether the proposed network design is more scalable or resilient than what may be considered industry standard.
- Affordability (25 points): Applicants are encouraged but not required to provide service
 at an affordable cost. This category scores prospective subgrantee's commitment to
 providing the most affordable price to the customer for 1 Gbps/1 Gbps service.
- **Fair Labor Practices (15 points):** Scores a prospective subgrantee's demonstrated record of and plans to comply with federal labor and employment laws.

Secondary Criteria

- Speed to Deployment (3 points): All subgrantees must deploy and begin providing services to each customer that desires broadband services within the project area not later than four years after the date which the subgrantee receives the subgrant. Scoring will be on a sliding scale based on number of months to complete proposed project.
- **Technical Support and Customer Service (2 points):** Will score an applicant's planned commitment to provide quality and responsive technical support to customers.
- Local Support and Community Engagement (8 points): Assesses a subgrantee's support from local units of government and/or tribal nations that intersect proposed project area.
- **Michigan Business (4 points):** Emphasis on supporting suppliers that create and maintain well-paying jobs in the state.
- MBEs/WBEs/GDBEs (3 points): Assesses the proposed utilization percentage of minority business enterprises (MBEs), women-owned business enterprises (WBEs), and geographically disadvantaged enterprises (GDBEs).
- Open Access (3 points): Scores a subgrantee's provision of open access wholesale fastmile broadband service for the life of subsidized networks on fair, equal, and neutral terms to all potential retail providers.
- Equitable Workforce and Job Quality (2 points): Scores a subgrantee's enforceable commitments with respect to advancing equitable workforce development and job quality objectives.
