# **Eligible Projects**

• Projects deploying qualifying last-mile broadband infrastructure to unserved (25/3 Mbps or less) and underserved (between 25/3 and 100/20 Mbps) locations

# **Eligible Areas**

• Elible areas were determined by the Mississippi Challenge Process. BEAM will update eligible locations <u>at this page</u>

#### **Eligible Costs**

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, including infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and multi tenant buildings
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible multi-family residential building
- Network software upgrades
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, and community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations

#### **Selection Criteria**

#### Scoring (maximum of 100 points):

- Minimal BEAD Outlay (up to 35 points): Points award based on a calculation of the net BEAD outlay (grant amount) vs total project costs and match as a percent of total project costs
- **Affordability (up to 30 points):** Points awarded based on applicants's 1 Gbps/1 Gbps monthly pricing, the less expensive the monthly rate, the more points awarded
- Fair Labor Practices (up to 10 points): Applicantions will be reviewed for requested certifications and narratives regarding historical compliance and plans to comply with federal labor laws
- **Speed to Deployment (up to 8 points):** Applications will be scored based on the proposed timelines for deployment
- **Community Support (up to 8 points):** Applicantions will be awarded points for community support based on the number(s) of letters received from citizens and elected officials

### Selection Criteria (cont'd)

• Network Scalability and Other Technical Capabilities (up to 9 points Points are awarded for network usable life, network scalability, and network resilience
