Eligible Applicants

- Cooperatives
- Nonprofit Organizations
- Public-Private Partnerships
- Private Companies
- Public or Private Utilities
- Public Utility Districts

Eligible Areas

- Providers will be allowed to define project areas using existing Census Block Groups (CBGs)
- A list of CBGs, associated Broadband Serviceable Locations, and benchmarking will be published before the main round application window opens

Eligible Projects

The **BEAD NOFO** outlines all requirements. Subgrantees must:

- Meet mandated financial requirements
- Demonstrate capability to provide broadband service
- Provides 100/20 Mbps service to all locations within service area and within required timeline
- Certify ability to comply with all mandates from NTIA and the State of Montana

Eligible Costs

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, including infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and multitenant buildings
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible multi-family residential building
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Network software upgrades
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, and community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations
