Eligible Projects

 Projects deploying qualifying last-mile broadband infrastructure to unserved (25/3 Mbps or less) and underserved (between 25/3 and 100/20 Mbps) locations

Eligible Areas

- Applicants are allowed to define their proposed project areas consisting of existing Census Block Groups (CBGs).
- CBGs in a project area do not need to be contiguous.

Eligible Costs

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, including infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and MDUs
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible MDU
- Network software upgrades
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including registered apprenticeships, preapprenticeships, community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations

Selection Criteria

Scoring (maximum of 100 points): Primary criteria

- **Minimal BEAD Outlay (up to 40 points):** Points awarded based on the percentage of requested funding above orbelowthe benchmark for the project area.
- Affordability (up to 10 points):
 - 10 points for symmetrical 1 Gbps service of less than \$70/month with no additional fees
 - O points for symmetrical 1Gbps service of \$160/month or more
- Fair Labor Practices (up to 15 points): Applicants will provide details of their past compliance with federal fair labor laws, andto commit to following federal fair labor practices for the life of the BEAD assets
 - o **10 points** for applicants who meet all requirements for past compliance
 - 5 points for applicants with 1 past violation
 - o **O points** for applicants with more than 1 past violation

5 additional points to applicants who commit to following federal fair labor laws for the life of the BEAD assets

Secondary criteria

- Speed Deployment (up to 4 points): Points to be awarded based on the commit to complete deployment. Points will be calculated as follows
 - 4 points for completing the build in less than 1 year
 - o **3 points** for completing the build within 1 year
 - 2 points for completing the build within 2 years
 - 1 point for completing build within 3 years

Selection Criteria, (cont'd)

- 1 point if the proposed number of locations for a particular project area exceeds the average number of locations across all project areas
- O points if the proposed number of locations for a particular project area is less than the average number of locations across all project area
- Unserved areas (up to 10 points): Points awarded based on the percentage of unserved locations in their proposed project area 1 point given for every 10% of unserved locations in the project area
 - 5 points if a project area contains 50% unserved locations
 - 8 points if a project area contains 80% unserved locations, etc.
- Number of Locations Served (up to 1 point): Points will be awarded to applicants based on the total number of locations (BSLs and CAIs) in their proposed project area.

Non-Priority Broadband Projects Only Scoring (maximum of 100 points)

- Primary Criteria
 - Up to 40 points for Minimal BEAD Outlay
 - Up to 20 points for Affordability
 - Up to 15 points for Fair labor practices
- Secondary Criteria
 - 1 point for speed to deployment
 - 1 point for speed of network and other capabilities
 - Up to 14 points for Unserved areas
 - Up to 3 points for existing infrastucture
 - Up to 4 points for length of service in Montana
 - 1 point for High-cost areas
 - 1 point for number of locations served
