# **Eligible Projects**

• **Priority Broadband Projects are:** Applications that propose to construct end-to-end fiber-optic facilities to all unserved and underserved BSLs in a Project Funding Area

# **Eligible Applicants**

- Nonprofit organizations
- Local governments
- Rural Electric Cooperatives
- Telephone Cooperatives
- Public-private partnerships, with private or nonprofit partners registered in MO
- Private Companies
- Public Utility District
- Public or Private Utilities

#### **Eligible Areas**

• Application areas were determined by the broadband office

### **Eligible Costs**

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, including infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and MDUs
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible MDU residential building
- Network software upgrades
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, and community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations

## **Selection Criteria**

#### **Determination of Priority Broadband Project vs Non-Priority Broadband Project**

- **Primary Scoring**: Applications within the same project area, the application with the lowest grant request will be selected
- **Secondary Scoring**: Applicants within 15% of the lowest grant request for the same application area, the following scoring will be applied
  - Up to 10 points Speed of technology
  - Up to 10 points Latency
  - Up to 4 points Speed to Deployment
  - **2 points** Round 1 preliminary grantee

#### **Application Process**

• Applicants must have been approved during the Prequalification Phase.
