

BEAD Map Challenge Process

Key Dates

February 29 – April 11, 2024: Public Comment Period

March 19 – April 18, 2024: Challenge Submission Window (30 days)

Late April, 2024: Rebuttal Submission Window Opens

Eligible Challengers

- Non-Profits
- Tribal Governments
- Local Governments
- Broadband Service Providers

Allowable Challenges

- BEAD eligibility. These include challenges to:
 - Availability
 - Speed
 - o Data Cap
 - Latency
 - Technology
 - Business service only
- Enforceable Commitments
- Planned or Existing Service (deployed by December 31, 2024)
- Identification of eligible Community Anchor Institutions
- Community Anchor Institution BEAD eligibility determination

^{*}Speed tests will be collected from individuals to be submitted by an eligible challenger in order to determine eligibility.

Submission Process

- Request a free CostQuest License
- The two license tiers available for the BEAD Challenge Process are:
 - Tier D: For entities that participate in any federal broadband programs. Licensees will be similar to those with an FCC Fabric Tier 2 license. Please follow the guide for requesting a TIER D License
 - Tier E: For entities that will challenge "Pass Through Entity" coverage maps (i.e. the CBO). Licensees will be similar to those with an FCC Fabric Tier 4 license.
