## **Funding Amount**

Up to \$128 million from U.S. Treasury Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund

- Congressional District 1 No less than \$40 million for eligible projects
- Congressional District 3 No less than \$40 million for eligible projects

## **Key Dates**

- February 9 Application Opens
- February 24 Application Closes at 5:00 pm Central Time
- March 1 Applications posted to the Commission website for review
- March 8 Notice of Intent to Challenge provided to applicant and the Commission (required)
- April 24 Supplemental information and/or responses to challenges due
- May 16 Commission determinations on credibility of challenges released
- June 2 Modified applications from successful challenges due
- June 20 or 27 Remaining final challenge results and grant award notifications released

## **Eligible Applicants**

- Broadband Internet Service Provider (ISP)
- Cooperatives
- Political Subdivision
- Tribal Government

## **Eligible Areas**

- Unserved or underserved areas in Congressional District 1 or 3
- Congressional District 3 projects must be entirely located within the geographical boundaries of cities of the second class and villages
  - Cities of the second class a municipality pop. <800 and >5,000
  - Villages municipality pop. containing not >than 100 nor <than 800</li>
- Unserved Area no access to broadband internet service of at least 25/3 Mbps
- **Underserved Area** no access to broadband internet service of at least 100/20 Mbps

<sup>\*</sup>Applications from a political subdivision or a tribal government shall be made as part of a public-private partnership with a broadband ISP



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# Eligible Projects

- A single project may request up to \$5 million
- Must meet a critical need of the community, related to access, affordability, reliability, and/or consistency (applicants must document critical need)
- Must have local support, demonstrated by community letters of support or feedback from public outreach
- Proposed service areas must be contiguous
- Proposed service area must not include areas with enforceable federal and or state funding commitment to deliver speeds of 100/20 Mbps
- May not fund more than 50% of the total project cost, when combined with any state or local funds

## **Application Contents**

- Applications must be received in PDF format (use fillable PDF provided)
- An application must include:
  - Section I Applicant Details
  - Section II Project Details
  - Section III Required Attachments
    - Label attachments as follows: "[Applicant Name] [Attachment Letter]"

## **Selection Criteria**

- Grant Prioritization Tiers
  - Tier 1 Unserved areas that have not received public assistance for development of a broadband network
  - Tier 2 Unserved areas that have received federal support for development of a broadband network but construction will not be completed within 24 months after the grant application deadline if determined that NBBP grant funding will accelerate broadband deployment
  - Tier 3 Underserved areas
  - Projects that include a mix of unserved and underserved will be considered in Tier 3
- Applications to be sorted into three tiers, will be reviewed and scored
- Applications are eligible for a maximum **160 points**
- Scoring Criteria:
  - Financial Capability Demonstrated (up to 10 points)
  - Legal Capability Demonstrated (up to 10 points)
  - Technical Capability (up to 15 points)
  - Digital Inclusion Plan (up to 5 points)
  - Rate Comparability (up to 10 points)
  - Speed Additive (up to 10 points)
  - Match Source (up to 10 points)
    - NUSF High Cost **0 points**
    - Certain Federal Broadband funds 5 points
    - Applicant and/or carrier outside funds 10 points
  - Match Percentage (up to 60 points)
    - Any match up to 60% will be awarded points on 1 point/percentage point basis



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## **Selection Criteria (continued)**

- Location Density (up to 20 points)
  - Less than or equal to 10 locations/sq. mile **20 points**
  - More than 10 but less than 20 locations/sq. mile **12 points**
  - More than 20 but less than or equal to 42 locations/sq. mile **5 points**
- Eligible Telecommunication Carrier Certification (up to 5 points)
- Public Private Partnership (up to 5 points)
- Tiebreaker If applications receive the same score, the application demonstrating lower per location cost will be given preference

## **Middle Mile**

Middle mile projects will be funded only if required for last mile build

### **Buildout Requirements**

- Completion prior to December 31, 2026
- Must offer broadband internet service in the project area for 15 years after receipt of grant funding
- Commit to maintaining minimum speed capability of 100 Mbps symmetrical for 15 years

## **Eligible Costs**

- Project planning
- Permitting
- Construction of facilities including both middle-mile and last-mile
- Equipment
- Installation and testing of the broadband internet service
