Eligible Applicants

May include, but are not limited to:

- Other levels or units of government (e.g., municipalities, counties)
- non-profits
- private entities, or
- Tribal Governments

Eligible Areas

• Locations that are unserved or underserved, lacking service of at least 100/20 Mbps

Eligible Projects

- Deployment projects designed to directly enable work, education and healthcare monitoring
- Projects that address a critical need resulted from COVID-19
- Projects to address a critical need of the community to be served by it

Eligible Costs

- Grant preparation costs
- Cost of repair, rehabilitiation, construction, improvement and acquisistion of real property, equipment and facilities
- Cost of long-term leases necessary to provide service
- Personnel costs
- Costs necessary to operationalize and put the capital assets to full use, including broadband adoption and digital literacy efforts
- Expenses related to compliance reporting and performance managment

Selection Criteria

Applications will be reviewed in a two-step process

Step 1: Pass/Fail minimum requirements

- Project area identifies fabric ID and addresses of unserved and underserved locations
- Evidence of critical need
- Certification that project will deliver service that reliably meets or exceeds 100/100 Mpbs
- Commitment to provide one low-cost option (not ACP) providing at least 100/20 Mbps
- Participation in the FCC Affordable Connectivity Program
- Completion date no later than Dec 31, 2026

Step 2: Scoring (maximum of 100 points):

- Number of Connections and speed up to 25 points
- Matching Request up to 20 points
- Project Readiness up to 15 points
- Project Sustainability up to 15 points
- Community Support or Engagement up to 10 points
- Economic Development and Community Impact up to 10 points
- Broadband Adoption Assistance up to 5 points

Application Process

- Application Submission (14-day window, dates TBD)
- Department Evaluation and Application Review
- Award Announcement
- Grant Agreement Negotiation
