• Internet Service Providers

Eligible Areas

- Unserved: Lack of access to speeds of at least 25/3 Mbps
- Underserved: Lack access to wire-line broadband speeds of at least 100/20 Mbps

Eligible Projects

 Projects that expand broadband infrastructure supporting at least 100/20 Mbps, scalable to 100/100 Mbps, to unserved and underserved populations

Eligible Costs

- Labor
- Network Construction and Materials
- Customer Premise Equipment and Installation
- Electronics
- Permits
- Professional Services and Engineering
- Infrastructure Equipment and Materials
- Fiber Equipment

Selection Criteria

Scoring (maximum of 1,065 points):

- Eligible Projects for Unserved and Underserved Areas up to 300 points
 - Formula: [300 x (percentage of houses in unserved areas)] +
 - o [300 x (percentage of passes in underserved areas/2)]
- Broadband Service Speed Based on a Graduated Scale up to 200 points
 - o **25 points**: ≥ 100/100 Mbps but < 250/200 Mbps
 - 50 points: ≥ 200/ 200 Mbps but < 300/300 Mbps
 - 100 points: ≥ 300/300 Mbps but < 500/500 Mbps
 - o **125 points**: ≥ 500/500 Mbps but < 750/750 Mbps
 - o **150 points**: ≥ 750/750 Mbps but < 1/1Gbps
 - o 200 points: ≥ 1/ 1 Gbps
- Rating Broadband Service Cost up to 150 points
 - The sum of the applicant's:
 - Grant Cost Percentile multiplied by 75
 - The number of points equal to ½ of the applicant's percentage of eligible project funding from all sources other than the ORBEG program
 - Grant Cost Percentile calculated by comparing the cost per address for each application, and assigning a percentage based on this number, the highest percentiles assigned to applicants with the lowest cost per address
- Tier 2 Service Coverage or Greater to Eligible Addresses in an Eligible Project up to 100 points
 - \circ **10 points**: for coverage to ≥ 500, but < 1,000 eligible addresses
 - \circ **20 points**: for coverage to ≥ 1000, but < 1,500 eligible addresses
 - \circ **30 points**: for coverage to ≥ 1,500, but < 2,000 eligible addresses

Selection Criteria (cont'd)

- \circ **40 points**: for coverage to ≥ 2,000, but < 2,500 eligible addresses
- \circ **50 points**: for coverage to ≥ 2,500, but < 3,000 eligible addresses
- \circ **60 points**: for coverage to ≥ 3,000, but < 3,500 eligible addresses
- \circ **70 points**: for coverage to ≥ 3,500, but < 4,000 eligible addresses
- \circ **80 points**: for coverage to ≥ 4,000, but < 4,500 eligible addresses
- \circ **90 points**: for coverage to ≥ 4,500, but < 5,000 eligible addresses
- 100 points: for coverage to ≥ 5,000 eligible addresses
- Local Support up to 100 points
 - 25 points: if the application includes a resolution of support from the board of county commissioners in the county where the eligible project is located
 15 points: if the application includes a letter of support from a board of township trustees, village, or municipal corporation
 - 10 points: for letters of support from a local economic development agency or a chamber of commerce
- Broadband Provider Experience. Technical and Financial Ability: Points awarded upon Authority's judgment; partial points may be awarded for this factor – up to 75 points
- Broadband Provider Experience Based on Years Provider Has Been Providing
 Tier 2 Service up to 75 points
 - o **10 points**: 4 years, but < 5 years of experience
 - o **20 points**: 5 years, but < 6 years of experience
 - o **30 points**: 6 years but < 7 years of experience
 - o **40 points**: 7 years but < 8 years of experience
 - 50 points: 8 years but < 9 years of experience
 - o **60 points**: 9 years but < 10 years of experience
 - 75 points: > ten or more years of experience
- County Median Income Based on the Median County Per Capita Income Projects
 spanning multiple counties, the score will be based on the percentage of eligible addresses
 for the eligible project in each affected county up to 50 points
- Affordability: Applicant offers 100/100 Mbps or greater at a fixed monthly rate—up to
 15 points
