# **Eligible Projects**

• Last-mile broadband infrastructure to unserved (25/3 Mbps or less) and underserved (between 25/3 and 100/20 Mbps) locations

#### **Eligible Areas**

• Applicants will propose projects at the school district (District) level, with the exception of Klamath County which has been divided into multiple District Grant Areas based on Klamath County Public School Attendance Areas.

### **Eligible Costs**

- Construction, improvement, and/or acquisition of facilities and telecommunications equipment, including infrastructure for backhaul, middle and last-mile networks, and multi tenant buildings
- Long-term leases of facilities to provide qualifying broadband service, including IRUs
- Deployment of internet and Wi-Fi within an eligible multi-family residential building
- Network software upgrades
- Engineering design, permitting, and work related to environmental, historical, and cultural reviews
- Personnel costs, including salaries and fringe benefits for staff and consultants
- Training for cybersecurity professionals working on BEAD-funded networks
- Workforce development including Registered Apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, and community college and/or vocational training for broadband-related occupations

#### **Selection Criteria**

#### Scoring (maximum of 100 points):

#### **Primary criteria**

- Minimal BEAD Outlay (up to 40 points): How much funding is requested
- Affordability (up to 20 points): 1 Gbps service to BEAD-funded locations that will not exceed a monthly cost of \$84.94
- Fair labor Practices (up to 15 points)
- Speed Deployment (up to 2 points):
  - o 2 points given for completing the build within 24 months
  - **1 points** given for completing the build within 36 months
