Eligible Applicants

- Municipalities
- Private and for-profit entities
- Electiric utilities
- Cooperatives
- Each of Oregon's nine federally recognized Tribes
- Municipal affiliates (economic development corporations, regional planning and development councils, and councils of government)
- Nonprofit organizations
- Partnetships between eligible applicants

Eligible Areas

 Locations in Oregon that are **unserved** or **underserved** and lacking at least 100/20 Mbps wired service

Eligible Projects

• The sole eligible activity is construction and deployment of Broadband Infrastructure Projects that offer reliable 100/100 Mbps broadband service to locations lacking at least 100/20 service

Eligible Costs

- Design, engineering, permitting, purchase, installation, and construction of broadband infrastructure necessary to complete a project
- Purchase and installation of custiomer premise equipment and installation of conduit or costs associated with customer drops

Selection Criteria

Total Maximum Score of 100 Points

- Applicant Information & project Contacts up to 10 points
- Project Description up to 30 points
- Project Readiness up to 30 points
- Grant Request and Budget Information up to 20 points
- Community Support and Letters of Support up to 10 points

Application Process

- Application Submission (30-day window)
- Curing Period (14-day window)
- Challenge Period (30-day window)
- Department Evaluation and Application Review
- Award Announcement
- Grant Agreement Negotiation
