- SF-242A Detailed Budget Justification spreadsheet
- Indirect costs and administrative costs, not to exceed 2% of requested grant amount
- Broadband Infrastructure Deployment projects planning, feasibility, and sustainability studies, not to exceed 2.5% (does not count toward the 2% of indirect costs)

Eligible Projects

- Broadband infrastructure deployment projects (Tribal Consent and Authorization required)

 including support of carrier-neutral submarine cable landing stations
- Affordable broadband programs
 - Providing free or reduced cost broadband
 - Preventing disconnection of existing broadband service
- Distance learning
- Telehealth
- Digital inclusion efforts (including digital equity planning and workforce activities)
- Broadband adoption activities

Scoring Criteria

Broadband Use and Adoption Projects: 100 Total Points Available

- Public Purpose and Benefits up to 40 points
- Project Viability up to 30 points
- Project Budget and Capacity Building- up to 30 points

Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects: 100 Total Points Available

- Project Purpose and Benefits up to 45 points
- Project Viability up to 30 points
- Project Budget and Sustainability up to 25 points

Based on an average of the reviewer's scores, applications will be assigned a rating of qualified or unqualified for funding for each priority grouping in accordance with the following:

Qualified for Funding: 70 - 100 points Ungualified for Funding: 0 – 69 points
