# **Eligible Applicants**

- State and Local Governments
- Federally recognized Tribes
- Nonprofits
- Incoporated, for-profit businesses
  - Groups of eligible entities can work together to apply

# **Eligible Areas**

• Rural communities with population less than 20k

# **Eligible Projects**

- Audio, video and interactive video equipment
- Broadband facilities used for distance learning or telemedicine (DLT) (limited to 20% of grant amount)
- Computer hardware, network components and software
- Instructional programming

#### Selection Criteria

#### Scoring (maximum of 110 points):

- Rurality up to 40 points
  - Population size of end user site
  - Relativeness of an urbanized end-user site to a city or town with a population of more than 50K
- Economic Need up to 30 points
  - County poverty percentage of end-user site locations as determined by the US Census Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates (SAIPE) program
- Service Needs and Benefits up to 30 points
  - Meet the need for DLT in the project area
  - o Benefits derived from proposed services
  - Involvement of the local community in planning, implementation and financial participation
  - o Identification of local economic, education or health care challenges
- Special Consideration up to 10 points
  - Projects that enable and improve DLT services to communities with a distressed score over 80
  - Projects serving rural communities with a Social Vulnerability Index score over 75%
  - Projects that enable and improve DLT servies on Tribal Lands
  - Projects proposed by a federally recognized Tribe
