

BEAD Map Challenge Process

Key Dates

April 9, 2024: Publication of Eligible Locations

April 18 – May 27, 2024: Challenge Submission Window (40 days)

Rebuttal Phase: Challenged Service Providers will have 40 days after receiving a challenge to

submit a rebuttal

Final Determinations: Will be made within 30 days from receipt of a rebuttal

Eligible Challengers

- Non-Profits
- Tribal Governments
- Local Governments
- Broadband Service Providers
- Educational organizations that are either a unit of local or Tribal government or a nonprofit (such as a public school district or public university)

Allowable Challenges

- BEAD eligibility. These include challenges to:
 - Availability
 - Speed
 - o Data Cap
 - Latency
 - Technology
 - Business service only
- Enforceable Commitments
- Planned or Existing Service (June 30, 2024)
- Identification of eligible Community Anchor Institutions
- Community Anchor Institution BEAD eligibility determination

Submission Process

- Request a free CostQuest License
- The two license tiers available for the BEAD Challenge Process are:
 - Tier D: For entities that participate in any federal broadband programs. Licensees will be similar to those with an FCC Fabric Tier 2 license. Please follow the guide for requesting a TIER D License
 - Tier E: For entities that will challenge "Pass Through Entity" coverage maps (i.e. the CBO). Licensees will be similar to those with an FCC Fabric Tier 4 license.
