Eligible Applicants

- Entities that serve or represent a covered population
 - Households with incomes below 150% of the federal poverty level
 - Aging individuals, 60 years of age or older
 - Incarcerated individuals except those in Federal correctional facilities
 - Veterans
 - Individuals with disabilities
 - Individuals with a language barrier, including English learners and those with low levels of literacy
 - Members of racial or ethnic minority groups
 - Individuals who primarily reside in a rural area
- Entities with history of successfully engaging covered populations
- Multiple applications from a single applicant permitted

Eligible Digital Equity Outreach Activities

- Interactive Workshops
- Surveys
- Townhall Discussions
- Data Collection
- Interviews with Covered Populations
- Eligible subgrantees may also propose to collect new data or provide existing data related to digital equity collected in the previous years
- Key Deliverable: Qualitative reporting and data on findings regarding digital equity that will inform the statewide digital equity plan

- Applicant is eligible per Eligible Applicant requirements
- Applicant has SAM UEID or indicated will apply for SAM UEID before executing grant agreement

- Diversity in stakeholder engagement within a given covered population
- Timeline and project milestones feasible given stated performance period and deadline for submission of final deliverables
- Proposed budget feasible given scope, details, and timeline of proposed activities
