Key Dates

- **June 15** Public Input Period Closed
- **August 15** Application Opens
- **September 13** DED Publishes Proposed Funding Service Areas (PFSA), challenges must be submitted within 30 days of PFSA map publishing
- September 29 Application Closes
- **November 11** Grant Award Notifications (at the latest)

Eligible Applicants

- Corporations
- Partnerships
- Limited liability companies
- Nonprofit organizations
- Local governments
- Rural electric cooperatives (organized under Chapter 394)
- Telephone Cooperatives defined in §386.020(55)
- Public-private partnerships, with private or nonprofit partners

Eligible Areas

- Unserved Area no access to wireline or fixed wireless broadband internet service with speeds of at least 25/3 Mbps
- Underserved Area no access to wireline or fixed wireless broadband internet service with speeds of at least 100/20 Mbps

Eligible Projects

- Must meet a critical need of the community related to access, affordability, reliability, and/or consistency (applicants must document justification for critical need)
- Must have local support, demonstrated through community letters of support, or by feedback from conducting public outreach
- Proposed service areas must be contiguous
- Proposed service area must not include areas with enforceable federal and or state funding commitment to deliver speeds of 100/20 Mbps



Eligible Projects (continued)

- The project may request the following funding (per project):
 - Minimum of \$100,000
 - Maximum of \$10M

Mapping Issues

- Applications must include a map file (.shp, .kml, or .kmz) of the proposed funding service area (PFSA)
- If applicant believes available broadband service is overstated in Form 477 data, the applicant must provide sufficient data to demonstrate that the proposed service area is unserved or underserved

Application Contents

- Applicant must be registered in SAM.gov, and provide Unique Entity ID generated by SAM.gov
- An application must include:
 - Proposed project budget
 - Documentation on project design, critical need
 - Proof of unserved and underserved areas
 - Map file of PFSA
 - Local support documents
 - Debt financing letters of commitment (if applicable)
 - Registration certificate from Missouri Secretary of state (if applicable)
 - Evidence applicant is not delinquent on Missouri state taxes
 - Documentation showing ownership interests
 - E Verify MOU
 - Workforce labor plan

Evaluation Criteria

- Cost match is not required, but prioritization will be given to projects with a private funding match of at least 20%
 - Additional credit given to projects receiving local government funding on a graduated scale exceeding the 20% match
- DED will prioritize projects addressing critical need related to access and affordability
- Evaluation Criteria
 - Critical Need and Equity (40 points)
 - Project Viability (40 points)
 - Level of Impact (30 points)
 - Affordability (25 points)
 - Sustainability (20 points)
 - Applicant Type (15 points)
 - Budget (15 points)
 - Private Match (15 points)



Middle Mile

- Middle mile connections that facilitate last mile connections are eligible
 - Projects must demonstrate new and/or improved last mile commitments are in place

Buildout Requirements

- Completion prior to September 30, 2026
- Applicants must offer one low-cost option without data usage caps, at speeds sufficient for a multiple user household to simultaneously engage in telework and remote learning
- Infrastructure must deliver service that reliably meets or exceeds 100 Mbps symmetrical
- DED will prioritize fiber-optic infrastructure, but other technology is eligible

Eligible Costs

- Construction of broadband facilities
- Final engineering and construction plans
- Permitting
- Installation
- Pole replacement or placement, but only as one component of an eligible project
- Applicants seeking to fund pole replacement/attachment costs will need to demonstrate they have cooperation from pole owners within the project area
- Make-ready cost
- Validation of service
- Costs incurred after March 3, 2021 but prior to grant award are eligible for reimbursement

Ineligible Costs

- Broadband planning not associated with the project
- Operational expenses
- Middle mile infrastructure not essential to servicing last mile projects
- Costs to procure or obtain certain telecommunications and video surveillance services or equipment as set forth in 2 CFR § 200.216 and 2 CFR § 200.471
- Acquisition of spectrum licenses
- Short-term operating leases
- Payment of interest or principal on outstanding debt incurred prior to March 15, 2021
- Fees or issuance costs associated with issuance of new debt
- Satisfaction of any obligation arising under or pursuant to a settlement agreement, judgment, consent decree, or
 judicially confirmed debt restructuring plan in a judicial, administrative, or regulatory proceeding
- Support or oppose collective bargaining
