Eligible Project Areas

Speed Threshold: Areas lacking access to 25/3 Mbps (download/upload) and no planned construction for completion within two years

Required Proof: Sources can include: FCC 477 data; Rural Digital Opportunity Fund Maps; speed test data, etc. (Note: Review Team will notify if additional information is necessary)

State Definition of Unserved:

a) Unserved: Areas lacking 10/1 Mbps;

b) Tier One: Areas having between 10 Mbps and 25 Mbps download & 1 Mbps and 3 Mbps upload

** Note: Degree of unserved vs. Tier One impacts final score

Eligible Entities

No specific qualifications noted - project score impacted by operating tenure, capabilities, experience.

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Eligible Projects

Must commit to serve at least 25/3 Mbps to all addresses

Buildout Requirement

Two Years: The entire project must be completed within two years of the projected start date

Challenge Process

Incumbent Challenge: Incumbent ISP may challenge on specific grounds after application published on Development's website (not later than 65 days after submission period closes)

Applicant Invitation to Revise & Resubmit: A successful challenge leads to application suspension and notification; applicant can revise and resubmit within 14 days. Failure to resubmit application with the successfully challenged addresses removed may result in rejection of entire application.

Application Requirements

- Project description & location (all residential addresses for unserved and Tier One areas)
- Notarized letters for commitment to offer 25/3 Mbps to specified addresses and none other
- Broadband funding gap, grant request, and match amount and source
- Managerial and technical expertise and experience
- Technology selection; description of the scalability of the project; speeds
- Customer service capabilities and policies (policy for crediting customers for service outages or failure to keep scheduled appointments for service)
- Operating tenure
- Proof of financial stability to complete the project
- A projected construction and services start timetable
- Anticipated government authorizations, permits, and other approvals; estimated timetable
- Existing or potential arrangements (including subleases or joint ownership arrangements) with another broadband provider, electric cooperatives, or electric distribution utility

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Scoring Framework

Scoring Methodology Total of 1,875 Points

- Degree of Unserved Residents vs. Tier One Residents (700 points)
- Level of Economic Distress in Service Area (630 points)
- Degree of Match Contribution (420 points)
- Leveraging Rights of Way, Conduit, or Public Facilities (50 points)
- Speeds and scalability: (40 points)
- Community and economic development and targeted of businesses and CAI's (5 points)
- Experience, technical ability and financial capability (5 points)
- Operating tenure (5 points)
- Demonstration of financial need to incentivize investment (5 points)
- Ability to leverage adjacent infrastructure e.g., middle-mile (5 points)
- Utilization and upgrade of existing networks (5 points)
- Location in opportunity zones (5 points)

Other Compliance Policies

Payment Schedule: 30% disbursed before construction; up to 60% periodically disbursed through construction; remainder disbursed within 60 days after completion

Reporting: Annual Progress Report; recurring Operational Report through completion

Non-Compliance: A notarized statement that non-compliance may require full/partial refund
