Eligible Applicants

• Eligible applicants include an organization, a telecommunications utility, or a city, village, town, or county that has established a legal partnership or joint venture arrangement with an otherwise qualified organization or telecommunications utility, and as such meets the eligibility requirements set forth in Wiss.Stat. § 196.504(1).

Eligible Areas

- "Underserved" an area that is served by fewer than 2 providers offering "Broadband Service"
- "Broadband Service" defined as 25 Mbps/3 Mbps
- "Unserved Area" extra points for areas with less than 5 Mbps/500 Kbps

Mapping Issues

- WI State Broadband Map
- Mapping webinar, Friday Feb. 11th
- If the PSC Map shows an area within a census block designated as "served," applicant must demonstrate the actual broadband service that is available in the area
- Geospatial data is required as part of the application
- Geospatial maps of proposed projects will be publicly available prior to the end of the opposition period
- Additional maps
- Grant map layers



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Application Contents

- Page 1: Signed Cover Sheet
- Page 2-3: Summary of Grant Application
- Page 4: Budget & Income Summary
- Page 5 plus: Project Map or Maps
- Remaining pages up to 30: Narrative
- Page 31-40: Attachments and supplemental materials that will be reviewed
- Page 40 end: Additional supporting materials may not be reviewed

Commission Evaluation

- Grant applications
- Comments of interested persons submitted in support as part of the application
- Opposition to one or more specific applications
- Ranking of the grant applications prepared by a preliminary evaluation committee
- Discussion memo prepared by Commission staff

Priority Factors

- **Match (10 points)** An application will receive credit based on the percentage of matching funds the applicant proposes to invest in its project and the variety of sources of matching funding provided by others
- **Public-Private Partnership (10 points)** An application proposing to build a broadband facility in partnership with a city, village, town, or county government
- **Unserved Areas (15 points)** An application proposing to build or extend broadband service to an area with existing service less than 5 Mbps/ 500 Kbps
- **Project Impact (15 points)** An application that proposes to serve a comparatively larger geographic area, a larger number of customers or communities in an area, or provide a higher level of performance or service quality
- **Scalability (5 points)** An application that demonstrates a commitment to increase the size or scope of its broadband network in the future
- **Economic Development (10 points)** An application that demonstrates the potential to promote job growth or retention, expand the property tax base or improve the overall economic vitality of the municipality or region
- Effect upon Broadband Service to Adjacent Areas (5 points) An application that demonstrates that it will not impair the ability of a competing broadband service provider to extend broadband service to areas adjacent to the proposed project area

- Funding is through Wisc. Statute 13.48 (30)
